Martha House, opened in 1987, is home to 13 people and **Frances House**, opened in 1998, is home to eight. Our **Day Care Centre** welcomes around five people each week and our respite care place offers vital support to ten families throughout the year.

Our homes are bright and modern and we provide the highest standards of round-the-clock nursing care and state-of-the-art facilities. Our full programme of specialist therapies and activities is tailored to each individual and designed to improve their health and their emotional wellbeing.



Homely comforts

The bedrooms at Martha Trust reflect the individual characters of the people who live in them. The profiling beds and ceiling-mounted hoists make bedtime as comfortable as possible and all the rooms have access to a fully equipped bathroom.



Mealtimes are a shared event with delicious, homemade food prepared by our highly experienced chefs. Wherever we can, we offer our residents a choice of meal and specific dietary requirements and personal preferences are all catered for in our daily menus.

Our residents enjoy a programme of therapies built around them. We have a hydrotherapy pool with a high-tech sound and light system, landscaped sensory gardens, a sensory room and a fully equipped Therapy Suite with Vibro bed and 42" Plasma touch screen.

There are regular visits from Pat-the-dog, a reflexologist, a physiotherapist and a music therapist, and trips out shopping, horse riding, to shows, concerts and the cinema, holidays and visits home to friends and family.

Martha House and Frances House are family homes. The residents get to know each other and all the staff really well, from the nurses and support workers to the maintenance people, cooks, cleaners and office staff.

Our residents can even Skype family members using our giant Plasma screen, giving them face-to-face contact when they can't be with them in person.



Alexandra





For the past 20 years Elizabeth has been able to enjoy her independence with regular stays at Martha. She can join in all the activities and therapies on offer, catch up with her friends, and relax and play in the hydrotherapy pool.

Her father, Humphrey, explained: *"Elizabeth gets a great deal out of her stays at Martha and it gives her mum and me a chance to catch up on some of the things we aren't able to do when she's at home. If she ever needed permanent care, we know Elizabeth would be safe and happy at Martha."*
