It's easy to assume that if you have difficulty communicating you'd find it hard to make your feelings known – but that's certainly not the case for Michael.

Michael is an extremely happy 27 year old with a wicked sense of humour and a real love of life and the people around him. At mealtimes he's adept at letting the staff at Mary House know whose help he'd like – and when they aren't paying attention he thinks it's great fun to 'spill' his drink all over them.

Michael has been at Mary House for six years and it suits him perfectly. He's at his happiest taking rainsoaked walks along the seafront and shouting into the wind. Throw in a helium balloon and he's in heaven!

In his previous placement, however, Michael never really settled. As it became clear he'd have to move, his parents discovered that Martha Trust had opened Mary House in Hastings, a little over an hour from their home in Croydon. According to his mum, Pat: "We phoned immediately and despite it being a Sunday we were

able to arrange a visit. Everyone, from the support workers to the cleaners were so friendly and caring that we knew straight away this was the place for Michael."

After a visit from a dedicated support worker, Michael came to stay overnight, and then for a weekend, before moving in fully.

The transition was incredibly smooth and the family hasn't looked back: "Life at Mary House is great for Michael and the staff have got to know and understand him really well.

"They know he loves water whether it's a walk in the rain or a session in the hydrotherapy pool. They know he enjoys music but doesn't like loud noise or confusion and that he needs a little quiet time occasionally. They know how important his friends are, even going to the trouble of taking two of his friends home with him for a birthday tea.

"And above all, they know they have to pay attention – especially at mealtimes!"
