

A word from the CEO

I'd like to welcome you all to our first newsletter of 2011.

We've had a wonderful Christmas at Martha which has brought to an end a year of immense change politically. We're now seeing the fallout of those changes with cuts to public expenditure announced in the Spending Review that will have far-reaching effects on Martha and our residents.

Included in these cuts is the scrapping of the mobility component of the Disability Living Allowance. The Government is arguing that travel for people in residential care is already

covered in their care package but this is simply not the case. Essentially, the Government is sacrificing the independence of some 80,000 of society's most vulnerable people in return for a punitive financial saving.

Martha is one of 27 organisations behind the report 'Don't limit mobility' which highlights the impact these cuts will have on people's lives. The report has been submitted to MPs and Martha has written separately to those involved urging them to reconsider.



We'll continue to campaign against these cuts and would ask you to support us by writing to your own MPs. A template letter can be downloaded from our website at www.marthatrust.org.uk/DLAletter

People-centred caring

In November of last year, Martha resident Dawn lost consciousness and was rushed into hospital.

The episode was brought about by a reduction in her medication, which was being closely monitored by Martha's nurses and support workers. This can be a difficult process when the person being treated can't always tell you how they feel or whether something's wrong.

But Dawn's reaction on this particular day was severe and shocking. Her body was limp and lifeless, and she was hardly breathing. Support worker, Laura, immediately raised the alarm and within minutes, nurses were at Dawn's side and the paramedics were en route to administer oxygen.

Dawn was rushed into Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother Hospital, Margate with Laura and Martha Trust Senior Nurse, Jane at her side. Laura and Jane were able to provide the medical team with detailed information about Dawn's medical history and current medication. Meanwhile Dawn's parents, Robert and Pam, had been alerted to the emergency and were able to meet Dawn as she arrived.

Incredibly, by 5pm that evening, Dawn was back at home at Martha and in her own bed, enjoying a bowl of

soup with a happy smile on her face. Her medication was immediately re-assessed by a specialist and has been working well ever since, and the cooks at Martha have designed a special menu for Dawn that should help to prevent this

Robert and Pam are amazed at how quickly their daughter recovered. They attribute it entirely to the care Dawn receives at Martha and the speed and efficiency with which the situation was handled: "What can we say - Martha's staff are the very tops. The skill, love and care they demonstrate is a great credit to the charity and we are extremely grateful."
