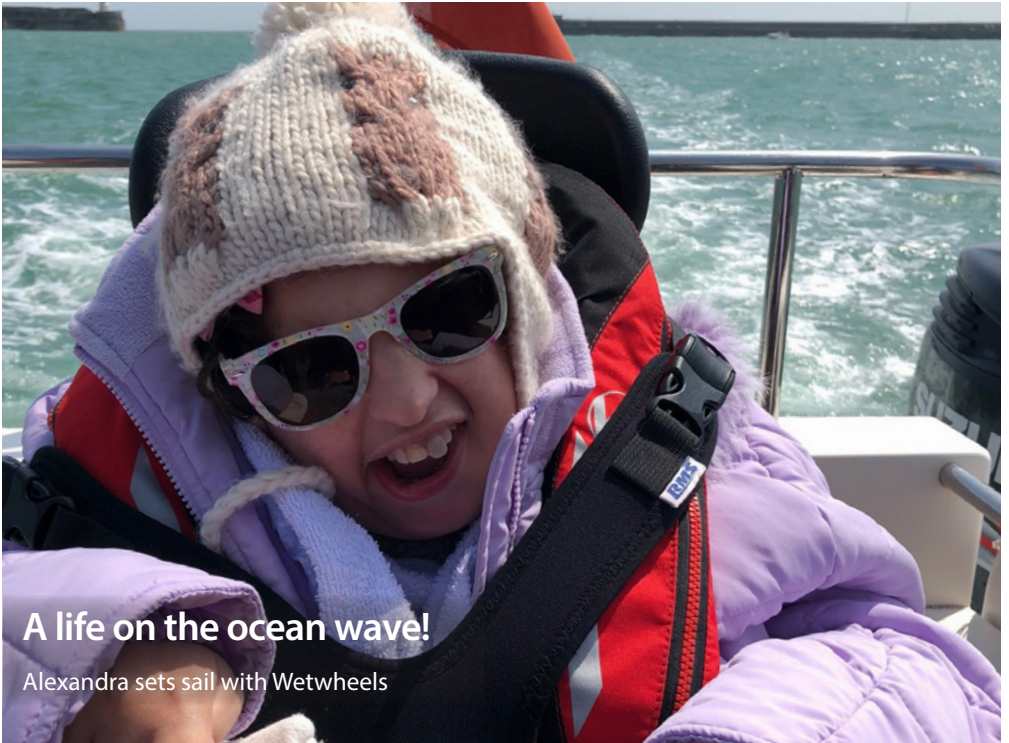

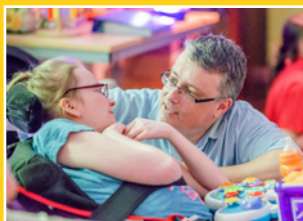

It has mostly affected charities with a world-wide remit, but as a charity that looks after some of the most vulnerable people in the UK, and despite having an excellent reputation on Safeguarding, we at Martha made the decision to review not only our policies but also our training and actions in relation to Safeguarding. From this we have revamped our policies but perhaps the key area is that we have employed an expert safeguarding consultant with an excellent reputation. Together we have developed a three year Safeguarding plan with the simple target of making Martha a lead charity in terms of keeping not only our residents safe, but also our staff, volunteers and families. To date we have trained our Safeguarding Champions who consist of operational staff and also our managers who will have the role of Designated Safeguarding Leads. You can never be complacent with keeping people safe, which is why we at Martha have made it an absolute priority.

A real team effort

We recently had a CQC inspection at Mary House and are very happy to report that we maintained our 'Good' rating across all of the five CQC Key Lines of Enquiry – Safe, Effective, Caring, Responsive and Well Led.

The inspector was very complimentary about the home and it was particularly heartening to hear her feedback relating to the Caring category. She made reference to the fact that people living at Mary House were "treated with kindness and compassion" and that their "privacy and dignity were respected".



On the face of it we would all expect this if we had a loved one living in a residential care home, but sadly it is all too clear from recent news stories that this is not always the case. In reality, to meet the standards set by CQC in these areas takes a huge commitment from the whole team 24 hours a day, 365 days of the year.



We are a learning organisation who strive to constantly improve the quality of the support we provide and be the best in our field, which requires our teams to be accepting of change and proactive in putting new processes in place.

Whilst safe and effective processes are a fundamental requirement, we are proud that we have a team of individuals whose passion and commitment means that treating our residents with kindness, compassion and respect is second nature.

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The meaning of life

At Martha our mission is to 'offer friendship and encouragement to the people we support, enabling them to achieve their own goals'.

This mission provides the foundation of life at Martha and all staff, whether they are providing direct care for our residents, managing the finances of the organisation, or maintaining our homes, work towards this goal on a daily basis. This, however, has its challenges.

Each resident who comes to live at Martha has an individual fee agreed with the NHS or Social Services for their care, dependent on their daily needs. Unfortunately, due to budget constraints the limited increases we have received over the years have meant that some residents' fees have not kept pace with rising costs. In addition there are the small matters of the National Living Wage and increased pension contributions to deal with.

In our area of work, costs have risen much faster than general inflation because of greater demands in terms of legislation, good practice and compliance with regulatory bodies. In fact we have found ourselves needing to spend progressively more today and tomorrow to deliver the same as we did yesterday.

The backdrop to this is that expectations of what we deliver are increasing and we have our own desire to strive for the highest quality, provide a meaningful and enjoyable life for the people we support and deliver against our mission.

We all make plans to fill our lives, as far as we are able, with hobbies, trips and fun activities that give us pleasure and build happy memories. This is no different for our residents and, despite any financial challenges we face, it

is our responsibility to support them to do this based on what they enjoy doing.

So, we have to be creative!

We are incredibly lucky to have very generous supporters and partners, who can sometimes step in to offer activities and experiences at no cost to Martha. This year a charity called Wetwheels did just that.

Having spotted them on Facebook, our Fundraising and Events Officer, Kerry Banks, contacted Sally and James Solomon from CIC Wetwheels South East and met with them. They kindly identified some funding to provide trips for our residents and the rest, as they say, is history.

Wetwheels was conceived and founded by disabled yachtsman, Geoff Holt MBE. 'Wetwheels South East' is a purpose built, high speed Cheetah power catamaran designed to get people out enjoying the water who would otherwise be prevented by accessibility issues when boarding a regular boat. And boy did our residents have fun!

Each resident who has been on one of the Wetwheels trips has clearly found it exhilarating, and everyone enjoyed the experience in a way that was very personal to them. Clare, who is registered blind, could not stop laughing as she felt the wind on her face and listened to the array of sounds - the powerful engine of the boat, the seagulls calling and trying to keep up and the splashing of the waves. We can only say a big thank you on behalf of our residents to Sally and James for giving us this opportunity.



Although we obviously focus on crucial fundraising for Martha, we also encourage people to support other charities, and many of our residents enjoy taking part in charity events.

It has become a tradition at Mary House, our home in Hastings, to support the Race for Life. And this year was no different. Our lovely ladies, residents and staff alike, donned an abundance of pink to take part in the local race! From the aerobic warm up at the start right through to the cheering crowds at the finishing line, everyone had



a fantastic time and thankfully stayed the course. This is not an easy achievement around the steep hills of Hastings' parks!

As well as trips out, our staff are very imaginative and come up with all manner of whacky ideas for activities within the homes. And what better excuse to dress up and have fun than Alexandra's Disney-themed 30th birthday party or indeed a Royal wedding!

But having a good time is not all about exciting trips out and lively parties. Sometimes we all enjoy just chilling out. We have dedicated sensory rooms where residents can enjoy quiet



time or perhaps a reflexology or aromatherapy session. And then there is the pleasure of settling down on the sofa with a good book.

Whatever our residents find pleasure in doing and whatever mood they happen to be in, our staff are always there to support each person to make choices in how they spend their time. They provide friendship and encouragement and help them to lead the fulfilling life they deserve.

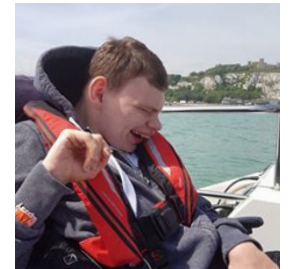

Wetwheels South East for taking some of our residents out for the day, they had an amazing time - their smiles really do say it all!



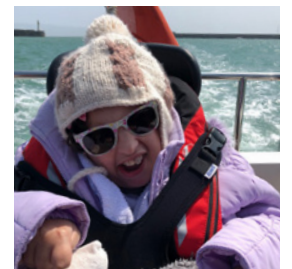
