PAYROLL GIVING

Payroll Giving is a simple tax-effective way to give to charity

Did you know that as a tax payer you are able to give more to your chosen charity rather than the tax man? By making a donation through your payroll, the tax man does not collect the tax on your donation, which in turn means you are giving more to the charity. Does your employer operate Payroll Giving? If not, now is the time to set up a scheme! As of January 2005, a Home Office funded initiative will reward small and medium sized businesses via a Payroll Giving Grant, once the scheme is set up and in operation. The Government are matching donations made by individuals up to £10 per donor for the first six months. Some employers may also wish to match donations made by their employees -benefiting Martha at no extra cost to you. If all our individual donors were able to give £5.00 per month through Payroll Giving, including the Government matching per donor for the first six months, Martha Trust would receive £81,090 per annum.

THE MARTHA

At Martha Trust our kitchen staff are very much aware that a good diet is central to overall good health. They believe that food should stimulate as many senses as possible and with this in mind they use only the finest and freshest of ingredients to create mouth-watering dishes that not only taste delicious, but look and smell great too. We believe that variety and balance using the finest ingredients improves the quality and taste of meals. The extra vitamins and essential minerals found in wholefoods help to boost our immune system making us feel altogether better.

Anne Platt, our Head Cook explains: "I try to use organic food wherever possible and most of our ingredients are from organic wholefood suppliers.

We incorporate as much fresh fruit and vegetables as possible into our residents' diets and use only fresh meat and fish purchased locally. Our menu is varied and changes often according to seasonal availability of ingredients. We love

to try out new recipes and every month we have a theme day, for instance a Mexican Day or Irish Day, and we prepare food using traditional food typical of that particular country. We recently had an Arabian Week where we featured a different Arabic country every day. The cooks excelled themselves and we had meals from Turkey, Morocco, Sudan, Lebanon and Egypt – without leaving Kent!"

Anne went on to explain that each resident has their own nutritional careplan which lists individual likes, dislikes and dietary requirements.

Most of our residents need full assistance with eating and require their meals to be mashed or finely chopped, but we always take great care to ensure that meals are presented appealingly on the plate. We use moulds in the shape of vegetables or special shapes to display the food and explain to each resident what's on the menu. An alternative choice is always offered if a resident doesn't like a particular type of food.

We take great care and pride in preparing healthy and nutritious meals and the residents really seem to enjoy them. The appetising smell of fresh baking wafting from the kitchen always attracts April who loves visiting our kitchen staff and checking out what they're preparing! She loves sitting by the kitchen door watching Cook stirring and kneading, tasting and seasoning and she knows there is always the possibility that she will be asked to help out with the tasting!

NEWS FROM AGAPE HOUSE

Respite and Day Care plans unveiled



The next phase for Agape House, our new home at Hastings, is to provide day care facilities for up to six people and two dedicated respite places.

A new day centre will include a hydrotherapy pool (similar to our facility at Deal, left) and a specially designed interactive sensory rooms which we plan to build in the grounds of Agape House.

These specialist amenities are not readily available in the Hastings area and are very much needed to help young profoundly disabled adults and their families.

It's another huge challenge in terms of fundraising, but if the support we have received so far is anything to go by, we know we can achieve it.
