

Welcome to our Spring 2013 newsletter



We've been incredibly busy over the past few months and have two new residents living at Martha including Steven Barley who you can read more about in this newsletter.

As a testament to our efforts, we received a glowing report from the Care Quality Commission following a standard, unannounced inspection at Deal.

Assessed against the Essential Standards of Quality in Health and Social Care we were found to be fully compliant – which is the very best we can be. But it was the comments in the report that were particularly good to read.

The inspectors found that 'staff members maintained eye contact with the people at the home and bent down to ensure they were at the same level' and that 'staff had noted the person's preferences for

daily activities such as when to get up or go to bed, what to wear and what toiletries to use'. The report also found that 'care plans were compiled with input from the person's family to ensure that relatives were involved in planning and delivering care.'

These things may seem simple but they are vital. By ensuring that our actions reflect our values we are, in the words of the CQC report, respecting the 'privacy, dignity and independence' of the people we care for.

New beginnings



Steven has a lovely sense of humour, a wonderful smile and deeply expressive eyes. He's fascinated by everything that goes on around him. And he absolutely loves life.

When the family visited Mary House they knew instantly that it was right for Steven and he moved in just before Christmas. While his parents stay in Yorkshire to sell their house, Steven has made Mary House his home. According to his mum, Melanie: "Steven settled in immediately and clearly loves it there."

"Being so far away has been hard for us but we've had a huge amount of support from the staff at Martha and it's taken a weight off our shoulders to know he's so well cared for. We get updates by phone and email and most importantly of all, Steven's two sisters Sarah and Helen are within easy reach and visit him regularly."

Steven's support worker, Jade, can't believe how well he's settled in: "Steven is such a wonderfully happy person he really lights



up a room. He loves one-to-one attention and laughs when you say something funny. He loves trips out in the bus, splashing around in the hydrotherapy pool and making noise with the musical instruments. His favourite time is in the evenings when everyone else has gone to bed and he can stay up with us to watch a film. He's made so many friends at Mary House it feels as though he's always been here."

Steven's mum is looking forward to being near Steven again: "At 24




Steven makes waves with his sister Helen
