

New beginnings

One of Martha's values is to be encouraging and supportive of each other. As part of that we pride ourselves on creating a culture of learning and development which benefits staff and ultimately the individuals we support.

It is important to us to identify untapped talent within our staff teams and to give people the confidence to realise their potential by applying for more senior positions within the organisation.

So when we identified a need at Mary House, our home at Hastings, for someone to lead on delivering therapy programmes for the residents and manual handling training to our staff, we looked no further than one of our existing team of Senior Support Workers, Lizzy.

Lizzy joined Martha Trust in August 2015 as a Support Worker. Less than two years later she was promoted to Senior Support Worker and has not looked back. She is now one of our most experienced, and qualified, carers.

Lizzy has always taken a keen interest in working with the physiotherapist and



taking the lead on working with the residents on their passive range of movement exercises and other therapies. Until recently she was doing this alongside her other responsibilities of being a Senior. But her role has recently changed to Therapy Lead. This involves Lizzy being the lead liaison with local health professionals providing Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy and Speech and Language Therapy for the residents at Mary House. Lizzy also shares responsibility for overseeing hydrotherapy in our state-of-the-art

hydrotherapy pool. The benefits of this new role for the residents at Mary House are already clear to see.

Last year Lizzy completed a four day RoSPA (Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents) Level 3 Award for Manual Handling Trainers qualification. Having reviewed the training materials to ensure they were compliant with the latest legislation, Lizzy now delivers regular training sessions alongside a colleague who trained with her.

Lizzy says "Since starting at Martha Trust I have developed personally and professionally. I have been supported and encouraged to do more. I



have learnt new skills and grown as a person. Last year I carried out a manual handling qualification, and have just taken on a new therapy role which I am really enjoying."

Alongside her work with therapies and training, Lizzy has also been given responsibility for formalising an existing social goal programme for each resident, which forms the foundation of the person-centred culture we promote at Martha. Social goals are based on a resident's likes and dislikes and are focused on participation in the wider community on an individual basis. This can include anything from joining clubs, groups, societies & organisations to volunteering at a local animal charity.

So, Lizzy definitely has her hands full. But she is an example of someone who has shown real ambition to further her career at Martha and relishes new challenges within a supportive environment. She says "I have learnt so much since working at Martha Trust and am still learning. Working with the amazing residents each day makes all the hard work worthwhile."

The Boys Are Back in Town

Having new residents move in to their new home at Martha is always exciting. Usually after many weeks or even months of preparation and transition visits, the day finally arrives when the staff are able to properly welcome them into their new community at Martha Trust.

It is unusual for us to have two young gentlemen move into one of our homes within one week of each other, but that is exactly what happened in October last year. And despite the obvious and usual challenges of getting to know their personality, health needs, likes and dislikes to keep them safe and happy, it has been an absolute delight for the team.

One of these gentlemen is called

Joe. He is 19 years old and is such a character he quickly had the staff 'eating out of his hand'. His wicked sense of humour is already legendary.

But Joe didn't come to Martha alone. He brought his sidekick Elmo with him, who he takes great pleasure in throwing at unsuspecting staff – and he has a very good aim! At Christmas Elmo was joined by Cookie Monster, so that spells double trouble!

Joe is mainly non-verbal, though he does have a few words in his vocabulary



and understands much of what is being said. One of the stories that stands out from the staff who support Joe is when he was in the activity centre one chilly morning. A fellow resident came to join him, who was wrapped up nice and tight to keep her warm, and Joe's reaction was to chuckle to himself and shout "Ha Snowman!" Laughter filled the room, as it often does when Joe is around.

Joe loves to be occupied and have fun. He especially enjoys Mondays when he

spends a good half an hour playing fetch with Pickles our beautiful 'Pets as Therapy' dog. Cartoons are one of his favourites, including anything Sesame Street related and Despicable Me, but he also enjoys films like Avengers Endgame.

In the activity centre he gets up to all sorts. Eye gaze is a firm favourite and when he uses the Magic Carpet he is always looking on the floor for the spider who appears on the screen then disappears.

It is really important to keep Joe physically active. His regular sessions in the hydropool create lots of splashes and playing with a basketball in the water is a popular

pastime. Just recently Joe has started using the physiotherapy walker, which we have decided should really be renamed the Roadrunner because he picks up some speed on it around Martha House. Our support worker Amber was surprised to find herself being chased down the corridor recently! It is safe to say that the staff have to have their wits about them.

As well as the range of activities Joe enjoys at home, he is very sociable and like most of us enjoys going out. He regularly goes carriage-riding where he is always very vocal, and recently had a great time at the Deal Music Club. But he is just as happy visiting the donkeys next door to the home, going on a shopping trip or visiting one of the many local seaside towns.

Joe's mum Sam commented " Joe moved in to Martha in October 2019 and he is very, very happy there. He is very well taken care of with regard to his health and social needs. He has lots of interaction with the staff and he seems to spend his whole day laughing. He enjoys hydro two or three times a week. He interacts well with the Music Man. The Physiotherapists are extremely good with him having recently got him back into his walker for the first time in 6 months.

"I am very happy with the overall service at Martha Trust and cannot praise the staff and facilities highly enough."

There is never a dull moment when Joe is around and we are so pleased that he has settled in to Martha House and is really enjoying his life to the full. This is, after all, what Martha Trust is all about.
